

Dr. Rajiv Reebye MD FRCPC

Dr. Rajiv Reebye is a Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation (PMR) specialist and Clinical Associate Professor in the department of Medicine at the University of British Columbia (UBC), Vancouver, Canada.

Dr. Reebye is a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians of Canada (FRCPC) and holds a specialist certificate in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.

He is an attending physician on the inpatient neuro-musculoskeletal program and on the outpatient acquired brain injury and neuro-musculoskeletal programs at GF Strong Rehabilitation Center, Vancouver, Canada.

He is also a consulting physician in the spinal cord clinic at BC Children's Hospital and at the UBC Multiple Sclerosis Clinic.

Dr. Reebye is the director of the New Westminster Rehabilitation Medicine spasticity clinic- a community based spasticity clinic focusing on the treatment of patients with adult spasticity and also children with spasticity transitioning to adulthood.

His research and teaching interests include casting post botulinum toxin injections for post stroke spasticity and use of ultrasound for chemodenervation in the treatment of spasticity.

Dr. Reebye enjoys clinical teaching and was awarded the Patricia Clugston Award for Excellence in teaching in 2012 and the Duncan Murray excellence in teaching award from the UBC division of PMR in 2010 and 2016.

He is a bilingual examiner (English and French) for the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada for physiatry.
